Bishop Joseph Chhmar Salas (1937-1977)

After the Khmer Rouge took power in 1975 all religious activities were forbidden. Catholics suffered persecution and most churches were destroyed. It was not until 1990 that Catholics and those of other faiths were free to worship. One of those who lost his life was Bishop Joseph Chhmar Salas, bishop of the Apostolic Vicariate of Phnom Penh and the first native bishop of Cambodia.

After the Khmer Rouge took power Bishop Joseph was sent to a forced labour camp where he died in September 1977.
