

Learn how to lobby your MP

If you helped make Fast Day happen for your parish, or if you are walking for water, thank you!

We are now looking ahead to spring, and as part of our new campaign **Reclaim Our Common Home**, we will be rolling out a new initiative in our communities, "Parliament in your Parish" and we have some training sessions coming up.

With the G7 meeting and the UN's climate talks being hosted in Britain this year we need to seize these opportunities and ensure that our Catholic voices are heard. And what better way to do this than by hosting a virtual meeting with our local MP to discuss how we can rebuild from the pandemic in a way that makes the world a fairer place, and tackles some of the major global issues of our time, from climate change to unjust foreign debts.

Through their duties in Parliament, our MPs can lend enormous support to these issues, helping us to bring about the changes that Pope Francis calls for. This training session will give everyone who wants to organise a virtual meeting with their local MPs the skills and confidence to do so. And to ensure that as many parishes as possible are able to attend this event, we are offering two training sessions on different dates.

Every petition signature counts

As part of the campaign please encourage as many people as possible to sign our new petition to the Prime Minister ahead of UN climate talks that will take place in Glasgow in November.

Collecting a lot of petition signatures is the perfect preparation for your meeting with your MP, as this sends a message that the Catholic voices in your community want to see leadership from the UK this year on climate action.

Three simple tips to collect more signatures:

- Ask your priest or parish secretary to include a link to the petition in the parish bulletin.
- Share the petition via twitter or Facebook and in any WhatsApp group you're part of.
- When someone from your parish, a friend or a family member confirms that they want to sign the petition, please ask them to spread the word among their networks too.
